PSAT/NMSQT

Saturday, October 14, 2017

Testing is at WHEELING HIGH SCHOOL.

The PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) will be administered at Wheeling High School on Saturday, October 14, 2017. This test measures verbal reasoning, critical reading, math problem solving and writing skills important for success in college.

We encourage all juniors to take the test. The PSAT/NMSQT can also be used as a predictor for SAT scores. It allows students to compare their academic skills with those of other college bound students.

Juniors who do well can qualify for some of the millions of dollars of scholarship money from the National Merit Scholar competition. Juniors who score in the upper 1% can be eligible for the National Merit Scholar Program.

ASVAB (Armed Forces Vocational Aptitude Battery)

Date: Tuesday, November 14, 2017

Register in the Assessment Center, Room 135 by November 8, 2017

Students should arrive at FVEC by 8:15am. The test will begin promptly at 8:30am. Enter through Door #4 from the north parking lot, Building A. This is a school day and students should be excused through 6th period and are responsible for all missed schoolwork. Students also must provide their own transportation to FVEC.

Accommodations for College Board Exams

SAT, Advanced Placement, PSAT/NMSQT

A student with an IEP or 504 designation may be eligible for accommodations through Collegeboard. Students must request accommodations to be submitted to Collegeboard. It usually takes 7-8 weeks for Collegeboard to approve any accommodation. The eligibility request needs to be done only once in the 4 years a student is in high school. After Collegeboard approves the accommodations, the school's coordination can verify annually that the eligibility requirements have been met.
